

ROW PROCESS

- When we build power lines, we meet one on one with landowners to acquire property rights – or an easement – providing us the required right-of-way needed for the safe construction, operation and maintenance of the power line. Transource believes property owners should be fairly compensated for any land rights that must be acquired. This project will require a 130-foot wide right-of-way for the 230 kV lattice structures.

RIGHT-OF-WAY PROCESS

Transource has two key philosophies that pertain to power line rights-of-way:

1 Line routes should avoid or reduce impacts to the natural and human environment where possible.

2 Property owners should be fairly compensated for any land encumbered by our project.
