APPLICATION OF TRANSOURCE PENNSYLVANIA, LLC FILE  
PURSUANT TO 52 PA CODE CHAPTER 57, SUBCHAPTER G, FOR  
THE APPROVAL OF THE SITING AND CONSTRUCTION OF  
THE 230 KV TRANSMISSION LINE ASSOCIATED WITH THE  
INDEPENDENCE ENERGY CONNECTION-WEST PROJECT IN  
PORTIONS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

Notice is hereby given that Transource Pennsylvania, LLC filed the above-referenced application with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) on December 27, 2017. The purpose of the Application is to seek PUC approval of the siting and construction of the Pennsylvania portion of the Rice-Ringgold 230 kV Transmission Line associated with the Independence Energy Connection Project approved by PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. to alleviate transmission congestion constraints and provide reliability benefits in Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia and Virginia.

The Pennsylvania portion of the proposed new Rice-Ringgold 230 kV Transmission Line will be sited to extend approximately 24.4 miles in Greene, Guilford, Quincy and Washington townships and the Borough of Waynesboro between the Maryland border and the new Rice Substation to be located in Franklin County. Subject to the PUC's approval, construction of the Project is scheduled to begin as soon as practicable following PUC approval to meet an in-service date of June 1, 2020.

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The PUC has scheduled a Prehearing Conference on March 13, 2018 at 10:00 AM in Hearing Room 4 in the Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, Harrisburg PA. The purpose of the prehearing conference generally will be to identify the relevant issues and interested parties, if any, and to establish a schedule for the submission of evidence, hearings, and other procedural matters if required.

Formal protests and petitions to intervene must be filed in accordance with Title 52 of the Pennsylvania Code, on or before February 20, 2018 and must reference Docket Number A-2017-2640200. All filings must be made with the Secretary of the PUC, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120, with a copy served on Administrative Law Judge Elizabeth H. Barnes, Administrative Law Judge Andrew M. Calvelli, and the Applicant.
